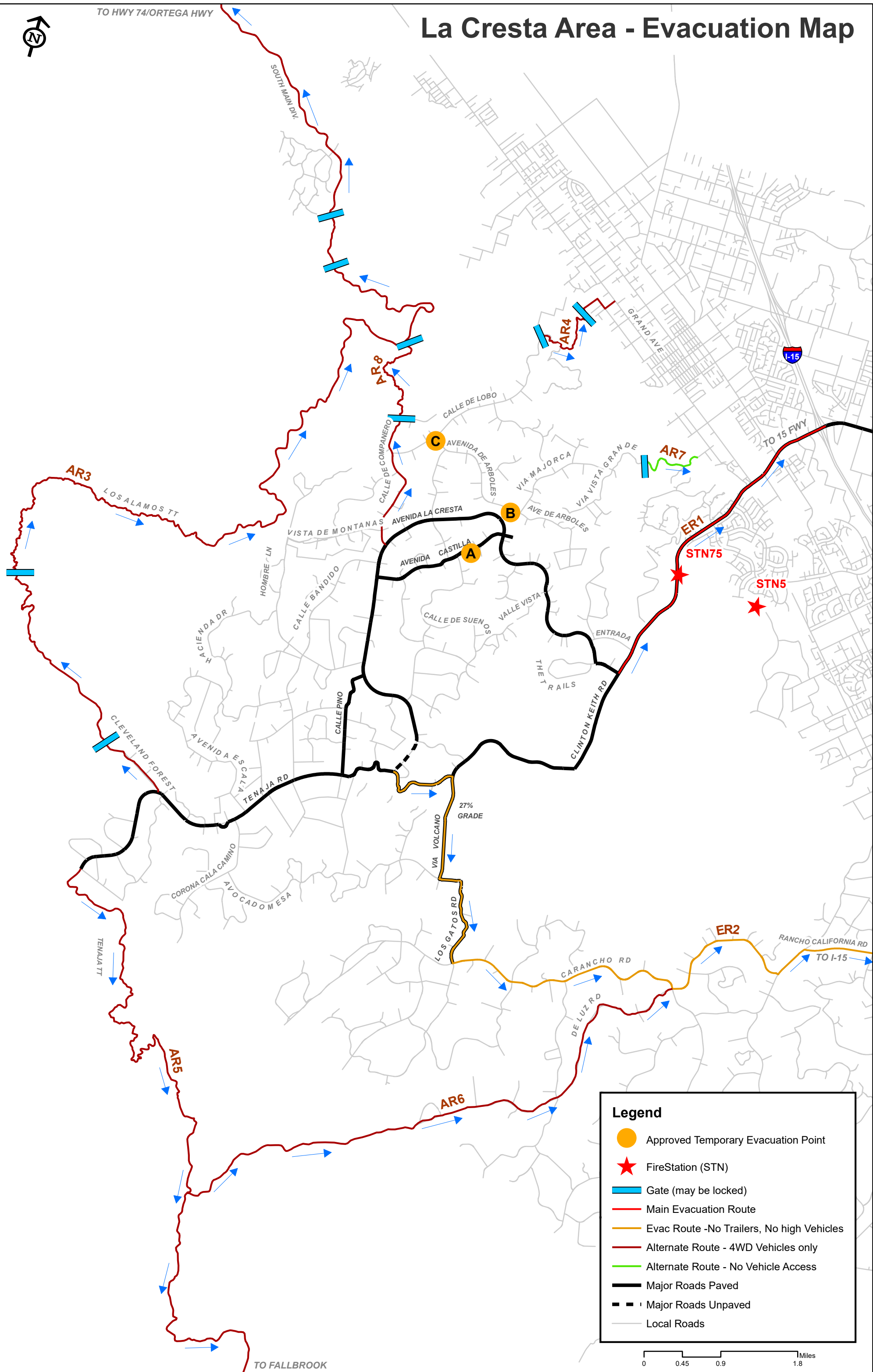


# La Cresta Area - Evacuation Map

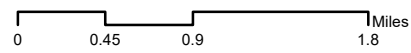


TO HWY 74/ORTEGA HWY

## Evacuation and Alternate Routes

### Main evacuation Route:

**ER1:** Clinton Keith Road to 15 FWY - 4.3 miles

### Alternative: NO TRAILERS/high vehicles

**ER2:** Los Gatos Road to 15 FWY - 12 miles (27% grade, no trailers or high vehicles)

Take Tenaja Road past the stop sign at Rancho CA Rd., becomes Via Volcano, turn left at the 90 degree turn onto Avocado Mesa, then turn curve right onto Los Gatos Road, go down the steep hill, at the bottom of the hill turn left at the stop sign onto Carancho Road, turn left at the stop sign onto De Luz Road, at the stop sign turn right onto Rancho California Road, continue to 15 FWY

### **Truck Trails or Forest Roads - DIRT - 4WD - GATED potential alternatives:**

**AR8:** South Main Divide Road (via Calle De Companero) to Hwy 74/Ortega Hwy- 11 miles

Directions: From Avenida La Cresta turn onto Calle De Companero, continue onto the dirt road (Old Woldomar Rd), turn right at the second gate onto South Main Divide Road/Wildomar Truck Trail, continue past the community of Rancho Capistrano onto the Ortega Highway.

This route includes a short section of dirt road (3 miles) then narrow, paved forest road. There are four USFS gates. The first gate is 1/4 mi just north of Calle De Companero on South Main Divide Road. The second gate is at Los Alamos x South Main Divide Road. The two other gates are located near Elsinore Peak towers and the community of Rancho Capistrano.

**AR3:** South Main Divide Road (via Cleveland Forest Road) – 21 miles

Directions: From Tenaja Road turn onto Cleveland Forest Road becomes Tenaja Truck Trail/Forest Road (7501) then Los Alamos Truck Trail, then South Main Divide Road, continue straight for 21 miles.

There is none/very minimal cell service on this route, it is a narrow paved forest road with multiple gates. On this route you will pass the Tenaja Trail parking lot, Fishermans camp, Tenaja Falls, Wildomar OHV area, Elsinore peak and the community of Rancho Capistrano. It ends at highway 74/Ortega Hwy near the Wildland Firefighters memorial and Cal Fire Station 51/USFS station.

**AR4:** Enderlein Road to City of Wildomar - 2 miles  
This is a dirt road and there are 3 gates on this route: USFS gate, Water District Gate and Private Owner. Large farm trucks do travel on this route and sedans at low speed may be able to travel on this road safely, however, due to it being mostly a private road the condition of the road cannot be guaranteed, nor can it be guaranteed that the gates will be open all the way to the City of Wildomar.

Directions: Follow Calle De Lobo to the end where it becomes dirt, continue past the white forest service gate onto Enderlein Road, Turn Right on Alameda

**AR5:** Tenaja Truck Trail

Directions: follow Tenaja Road past the Cleveland National Forest Road, continue where it becomes dirt, turn left onto Margarita Road/Tenaja Truck Trail, continue on Tenaja Truck Trail/De Luz Truck Trail until you get to the bottom of the hill at the Welburn Gourd Farm. Turn right on De Luz Road. - 6 miles

Follow De Luz Road (South) until you get to the town of Fallbrook - 10 miles

OR

**AR6:** Take De Luz Road (South), turn left on De Luz Murrieta Road, continue onto De Luz Road, turn right at the stop sign onto Rancho California Road to the 15 FWY -16 miles

**INCOMPLETE ROAD/potentially hikeable (no vehicle access)**

**AR7:** Claremont Street to City of Wildomar - 1.5 miles (approximately 1500ft unpaved/trail)

Directions: At the end of the cul de sac at Via Vista Grande turn left onto the trail at the red gate, follow this until the cement begins for Claremont Street, turn onto Grand Avenue

## Temporary Evacuation Points

Temporary Evacuation Points (TEP) are available for residents who have been displaced by evacuation orders. A TEP provides a safe staging area for you to park and remain in your vehicle while displaced by the emergency. TEPs are only used on a short-term basis before you are permitted to return home, figure out your next move, or are referred to another location.

These TEPs are sponsored by LCPOA and are vacant, mowed, 5-acre parcels. They may be used as emergency refuge or for large animal/livestock staging. TEPs shall not be used unless directed by emergency officials or as designated during an emergency by the LCPOA. The usability and safety of each location is case specific and dependent on current fire or emergency conditions.

NOTE: this map includes potential evacuation and alternate routes for the La Cresta Area. In the event of an evacuation, please follow the instructions of emergency personnel. For further information regarding evacuations and shelter in place, please contact Riverside County EMD and Cal Fire.

## BE READY

### Plan your escape now!

Know **TWO** ways in and out.

When you receive this handout you should **highlight** your evacuation route, post the map in a conspicuous location and keep a copy in your vehicle! Then practice. **Drive and know your route before an emergency happens.** Fire conditions may change rapidly and smoke can greatly limit visibility! Power outages may mean cell phones and GPS units do not function properly. Road closures may keep you from re-entering your neighborhood or may change your planned evacuation route, know an alternative! **Have a plan** for you and your animals if you are home and if you are not home or if your family is split up. Remember by evacuation early, you give your family the best chance of surviving a wildfire. You also help firefighters by keeping roads clear of congestion and enabling them to focus on their job.

**GET ALERTS** – sign up for emergency alerts and know where to get information during an emergency

**Make a PLAN** – for if you are home or not home

**Pack a GO bag** with things you need

**Build a STAY box** for if you can't leave

**HELP** friends and neighbors get ready

### Know what each evacuation order is directing you to do:

**Evacuation Warning:** Potential threat to life and/or property. Those who require additional time to evacuate, and those with pets and livestock should leave now. Have time to hook up trailers and gather belongings.

**Evacuation Order:** Immediate threat to life. This is a lawful order to leave now. The area is lawfully closed to public access. Must go now, no time for anything!

**Shelter in Place:** Go indoors. Shut and lock doors and windows. Prepare to self-sustain until further notice and/or contacted by emergency personnel for additional direction. Usually this means to shelter at home but it also may mean a designated location.

Alert RivCo is used to alert Riverside County community members of urgent actions to take during disasters, such as earthquakes, wildfires, and floods.

**Tune in:** Radio stations may have emergency information KFRG 95.1 and, AM KNX 1070; for San Diego area KOGO AM 600
